Dv. 12 also served as the basis for today's FN Principles of Riding, the German National Equestrian Federation's official instruction manual. Free of the alterations that were introduced to the FN Principles of Riding at a later time to accommodate the world of modern equestrian sports, these pure and simple "how tos" represent the culmination of hundreds of years of proven cavalry experience and show a remarkable insight into the nature of the horse and the biomechanical realities of horse and rider.
